Aquaponics	D.	Organic waste that can be broken down and be decomposed to return to be used by nature as soil.
Biodegradable waste	E.	Animal or plants species that have been intentionally or unintentionally introduced to a different habitat by humans. They may disrupt native species by dominating their habitats.
Over consumption	F.	Areas on Earth that contain rich reservoirs of plant and animal life. These unique regions of the world with high numbers of endemic species are unfortunately also home to most of Earth's threatened species.

Biodiversity	Н.	These wastes cannot decompose or be broken down by natural processes and remain in the environment for years. Examples are plastics, glass products, or nylon.
Compost	I.	Using an item more than once in order to save money, time, energy and resources. This prevents the need to buy more products and produces less waste.
Endangered species	J.	Preserving or protecting animal and plant species as well as resources by taking actions to prevent further harm to them.
Habitat	K.	Involving methods that do not completely use up or destroy natural resources.
Invasive species	L.	A community of organisms that depend on each other and the environment they inhabit.
Endemic species	M.	A rich soil-like material produced from decayed plants and other organic matter, such as food and animal waste, that decomposes (breaks down) naturally.
Non-biodegradable waste	N.	An area occupied by a community or species (group of animals or plants), such as a forest floor, desert or sea shore.
Sustainable	O.	A species that can only be found at a particular place and nowhere else on the planet.
